



FNE Organization Band

Centered above the right breast pocket with the bottom of the patch along the top seam of the pocket flap




FNE Coat of Arms

Centered on the right arm, 2.5 cm (1 in) below the shoulder seam



Skill Badges

Worn on the right arm, 2.5 cm (1 inch) below the coat of arms. These triangular badges are placed with the long side on the top in three neat columns.



FNE Belt

Worn around the waist through belt loops



Rosary

A one-decade FNE Rosary hangs from a clip on the right side of the belt




Shorts

Navy blue shorts no longer than 2.5 cm (1 inch) above the knee



Socks

Knee-high navy blue socks



Timber Wolf Beret

Worn after a Timber Wolf makes his promise. The Promise Badge goes in the center with the first and second star on either side after they have been earned.



Necker & Woggle

Rolled tightly and secured in the front by a woggle



Six Badge

Centered on the left arm, 2.5 cm (1 inch) below the shoulder seam



Sixer Stripes

Seconders wear one and Sixers wear two 8 cm (3 inch) yellow ribbon stripes, 2 cm (3/4 inch) below the Six Badge



FSE Cross Badge

Centered on left breast pocket



Leather Pouch & Rope

Worn on the left side of the FNE belt. Inside: Mowgli handbook, a pencil, a notepad, and a handkerchief. The rope hangs from a belt clip behind the pouch.





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
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
Skirt or Skort

Navy blue skirt or skort with length from one inch above to one inch below the knee



Socks

Knee-high navy blue socks



Timber Wolf Beret

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How to Properly Wear the FNE Timber Wolf Uniform

This information is excerpted from the FNE Uniform Policy.

T-Shirt

The T-Shirt should be tucked in at all times. When the button-up shirt is worn, the T-Shirt should be worn underneath it.

Button-Up Shirt

The button-up shirt will be worn for most meetings and activities. It should be tucked in neatly. Patches should be neatly and securely sewn on (see Patch Placement Guide). The top button is never buttoned but all other buttons including the cuff and pocket buttons should be buttoned. A pen or pencil should always be carried in the left breast pocket (part of the pocket is separated for this purpose).

Tips:

- The military tuck is an easy way to tuck in a shirt so that it will look nice and stay tucked in: <http://agoodman.com.au/how-to-tuck-in-a-shirt-so-that-it-stays-tucked/>
- A pen may be more convenient, but a mechanical pencil will never cause an ink stain.

Neckerchief

The Neckerchief should be neatly rolled, leaving a small triangle showing. It is always worn over the collar and should be secured in the front by a woggle/slide or a square knot.

Shorts/Skirt/Skort & Belt

The rosary clip is worn on the right side of the belt. The pouch is worn on the left side of the belt, and the clip for rope is worn immediately to the rear of the pouch. The “smooth” side of the rivets on the clips should face outwards. The decorated side of the rosary should face outwards. The rope should always be properly coiled (Timber Wolves will learn how to do this in their meetings).

Tips:

- It is very difficult to adjust the belt while wearing it. Adjust the belt to the proper size before threading it through the belt loops.
- It is much easier to thread the belt through the belt loops and attach the pouch and clips when the shorts/skirt are not being worn. It is highly recommended that if the shorts/skirt do not need washing, leave the belt on with the clips and pouch on it when you store the uniform between meetings/activities.

Socks

The socks should come up to the knee cap but not cover it. Fold the top of the knee sock if necessary so that it is worn below the knee cap.

Beret

The Timber Wolf beret is a basque-style beret, not the military-style beret that the Explorers, Wayfarers, and Chiefs wear. It should be worn flat, not pulled to one side like the military berets. The tag should be in the back. The leather sweatband should be on the inside, against the head. In church or at prayer, girl Timber Wolves keep their berets on. Boys should remove their berets, fold them neatly in half, and stick them neatly under their left epaulette.
